MISTERTON CHARITIES

Need some help with your fuel bills? Know a student struggling with course costs?

Then did you know that a set of charitable funds exists for the benefit of parishioners of Misterton and Walcote. Perhaps the best known fund is the Misterton Poors Charity, set up to provide "2 sacks of coal for winter for those receiving Alms from the Parish, being resident in the Parish for at least two years" now evolved into a more general winter fuel assistance payment.

However, there are separate funds to help support those who need help to "further their education or apprenticeships by contributions to the purchase of books or other materials" and "to alleviate hardship to the provident poor". The language seems old fashioned but the Charities do date back to before the English Civil War – 1637 to be exact!
